

School Network Reviews NZPF Position Paper

NZPF representation is mandatory at all stages of any Network Review.

NZPF holds to the following beliefs:

- The Ministry of Education needs to consider undertaking initiatives to develop sector and community capability:
- Sponsor independent non-Ministry evidence based research on cultural/behavioural change in the schools that have been affected by the first round of school network review policy;
- Sponsor independent non-Ministry evidence based research on the support systems required for cultural shifts to impact on student learning. This evidence would guide schools in making a difference to student learning as opposed to putting energies into measuring student learning;
- Sponsor independent non-Ministry evidence based research on what learning occurs in the first year of a network review;
- Publish principal narratives on Leadspace on successful methodologies used during the first year of a network review;
- Shift the Ministry of Education emphasis more to school improvement and less on property economic priorities. This could be signalled by replacing the term Network Review with School Improvement and place responsibility in the hands of a more appropriate group within the Ministry of Education;
- Position resources, support and human resources well before any re-culturing or restructuring process commences (Principals need access to adequate support for property and personnel issues to ensure they can deal with the business of reculturing the re-constituted school minus additional and competing demands);
- Involve sector groups in the analysis and evaluation of the school network review policy. Policy without understanding of behavioural and cultural issues is flawed as research shows;
- Consider seconding a support action team of experienced credible principals who can guide school principals, boards and the community on re-culturing merged schools:
- Review the difficulties experienced by principals and teaching staff in merger schools-the review data will enable the MoE to plan effectively if in the future the network review policy is continued;
- Second a support team to work alongside all principals and re-constituted school boards . this team could be a composite team of STA and NZPF;
- Develop a team of lead principals to assist behavioural/cultural change;

- Develop school community capacity to clearly identify current student learning outcomes which are then discussed prior to any decisions being made about school network review;
- Demand that Ministry officials analyse school data and evidence of student achievement with principalsqprior to any decision making process-NZPF believes no evidence is available in the guiding of school network review decisions;
- And, finally-that unless there is a clear economic reason concerning a school
 viability that all decision making be around best learning and teaching outcomes
 tracked back to current New Zealand research.
